## 2023 EASTWOOD CANDIDATE FORUM

This November 7th, voters in the city of Houston will choose a new Mayor and weigh in on the make-up of Houston's city council. Incumbent Mayor Sylvester Turner is term-limited and cannot seek re-election to a third term. District I councilman Robert Gallegos is also term-limited as councilman, so a new member will be elected to represent greater Eastwood for the District I position.

During the May 1st general membership meeting, the Train Committee hosted a candidate forum designed to ask candidates about issues specific to the East End, such as train congestion and noise, crime, city spending, infrastructure, and more. We saw this as an opportunity for candidates to introduce themselves and share with residents about their platforms.

By holding the forum early in the election season we had a large turnout of candidates. The committee invited anyone running for mayor, at-large city council (who represent the whole of the city of Houston) or District I (The area that represents Eastwood) to participate.

For the mayor's race, we hosted Amanda Edwards, Lee Kaplan, Robert Gallegos, and Gilbert Garcia.

For city council, we welcomed:

At-large 1: Casey Curry, Leah Wolfthal, and Conchita Reyes

At-large 2: Holly Flynn Vilaseca, Nick Hellyar, and Obes Nwabara

At-large 3: James Joseph

At-large 4: John Branch

At-large 5: Sallie Alcorn

District I: Joaquin Martinez (could not attend because of an unexpected family emergency)

District H: Cynthia Reyes-Revilla (running to represent a district adjacent to ECA boundaries)

We offered each candidate free time to discuss their campaign and qualifications, asked them to weigh in on solutions to challenges facing our neighborhood, and offered a 'lighting round' to quickly cover many topics. During this portion, we offered candidates a 'yes' and 'no' sign, with the option not to weigh in if the issue was either too dependent on conditions, or if they could not respond.
